

The Fifth Most Important Verse in the Bible

Galatians 2:20 (with defining elements from Ephesians 5:30-31)

New King James Version (Modified - Recommended for memorization).

I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.

(For we are members ... of His flesh ... and the two shall become one flesh.)

King James Version

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

(For we are members ... of his flesh, ... and they two shall be one flesh.)

Young's Literal Translation

With Christ I have been crucified, and live no more do I, and Christ doth live in me; and that which I now live in the flesh -- in the faith I live of the Son of God, who did love me and did give himself for me.

(Because members we are ... of his flesh, and ... they shall be -- the two -- for one flesh.)

[Sadly, all of the paraphrases fall woefully short because they try to explain Galatians 2:20 without understanding it or even believing it.]

The Speaking of Christ (paraphrase by Daniel Yordy – partly written before doing the present study.)

I AM fully crucified with Christ, but I am still alive – alive unto God, only it's not me, it's Christ, only it is me, the me brand-new alive unto God. And the life I live in this present body of flesh, flesh of God's flesh, I live inside the faith of the Son of God who loves me and who traded His self for my self.
